AGGREGATE RESULTS DECEMBER 2005 - NOVEMBER 2009

- 4,637 clients served
- 1,970 volunteers
- 5,450 meals provided

PHC 1 - December 8, 2005

- 500 clients
- 200 volunteers
- 20 agencies
- 500 meals
- Noteworthy information and statistics:
 - SSA helped 100 people, including 5 new cases and 25 appointments
 - Gardner Family Health assisted 250 people, including 25 flu shots and 15 glucose tests

PHC 2 - April 27, 2006

- 300 clients
- 250 volunteers
- 30 agencies
- 300 meals
- Noteworthy information and statistics:
 - Social Services assisted 35 people with food stamps and 21 people with SSI/SDI.
 - 48 people received immediate assistance with emergency shelter and long-term housing.

PHC 3 - December 3, 2006

- 500 clients
- 250 volunteers
- 30 agencies
- 600 meals
- Noteworthy information and statistics:
 - 150 people received haircuts from over 50 Gavilan College cosmetology students.
 - Three mobile dental and medical clinics were onsite providing services to clients and veterans
 - 50 new cases were opened for County social services such as food stamps, medical, and general assistance

PHC 4 - May 17, 2007

- 600 clients/guests
- 250 volunteers
- 36 agencies
- 600 meals
- Noteworthy information and statistics:
 - 72 people received ID cards through the Department of Motor Vehicles.
 - 26 people were registered to vote by the County of Santa Clara Registrar of Voters.
 - 21 new applications for Social Security Administration disability benefits and Social Security card replacements.

PHC 5 - December 5, 2007

- 700 clients/guests
- 260 volunteers
- 38 agencies
- 700 meals
- Noteworthy information and statistics:
 - 100 people received new carts to carry their possessions.
 - Over 40 people secured housing as a result of the event's services.

PHC 6 - May 15, 2008

- 850 clients/guests
- 350 volunteers
- 49 agencies
- 800 meals
- Noteworthy information and statistics:
 - 17 people were permanently housed.
 - 188 DMV ID vouchers were distributed by Santa Clara Adult Education.
 - 253 people received haircuts from Gavilan College cosmetology students.
 - 36 clients received primary medical care from Gardner Family Health Network, Inc.
 - 24 clients received dental care from Tzu Chi Foundation.

PHC 7 - November 21, 2008

- 600 clients
- 300 volunteers
- 50 agencies
- 1,100 meals
- Noteworthy information and statistics:
 - 21 people were permanently housed.

- 39 households were provided with permanent housing security deposit and first month's rental assistance.
- 56 people received ID from the Department of Motor Vehicles.

PHC 8 (Project Family Connect) - May 14, 2009

- 350 clients/guests
- 30 volunteers
- 37 agencies
- 500 meals
- Noteworthy information and statistics:
 - The event was hosted at InnVision's Georgia Travis Center, the new One Stop Homeless Prevention Center
 - 12 people were permanently housed.

PHC 9 (Project Youth Connect) - October 17, 2009

- 150 clients served
- 20 client volunteers
- 13 agencies
- 200 meals served
- Noteworthy information and statistics:
 - The event was hosted at Bill Wilson's Drop-In Center.
 - 90 clients received haircuts.
 - Bill Wilson's Drop-In Center saw youth that we not regular clients come to the event.

PHC 10 (Project Veterans Connect) – November 10, 2009

- 87 clients served
- 10 client volunteers
- 17 agencies
- 150 meals served
- Noteworthy information and statistics:
 - The event was hosted at EHC LifeBuilders' Boccardo Reception Center.
 - 23 Clients received haircuts.
 - At least 20 clients did not have an HMIS number, and had not been previously served.
 - Project HIRED recruited 15 clients to receive information about their services.
